



Hawaii was an integral supporter of Near East Relief (NER), the American-led campaign that quickly sparked an international response with its unprecedented humanitarian endeavor, mobilizing all segments of American citizenry including elected officials, celebrities and laypersons alike, to help rescue victims of the Armenian Genocide in Ottoman Turkey from 1915-1930.

> Near East Relief Must Raise \$25,000 in Hawaii this Year.

• Hawaii established an NER office to facilitate all relief efforts throughout the region, which was located at the Hawaiian Trust Co. in Honolulu.

• Hawaii's NER committee was established in large part due to the work of the Rev. Dr Lincoln L. Wirt, an American Congregational minister and the international commissioner of the NER.

• After embarking from San Francisco aboard the *Golden Gate* in January 1922, Lincoln Wirt's first port of call was Waikiki, Hawaii, where he was warmly received at a reception held in his honor at the royal palace.

• At the event, an Armenian relief committee was formed with the American

governor, Sanford B. Dole, as its chairman and the wife of the well-known missionary Dr. William D. Westervelt as its secretary. Under their guidance, Wirt was sent to every town on each island appealing for aid on behalf of the suffering Armenians. Wirt noted that "in every community committees were set up and a thorough canvas for funds inaugurated."

• As part of the intensive campaign in Hawaii, to which E. Guy Talbott of California, regional director for Near East Relief, was invited, Hawaii netted \$25,000 cash and several thousand dollars in pledges. At a Sunday morning service in the Central Union Church, Honolulu, \$10,800 was contributed, one check being for \$5,000.







• On the day of Dr. Wirt's departure from Hawaii, he was handed a sum of \$50,000 from the committee, which was twice the expected quota from the island. Hawaii's Armenian relief committee continued to generously contribute funds and by the late 1920's had successfully collected over \$200,000 (about \$2.8 million dollars in today's terms) for the NER, which was regarded at the time as a remarkable achievement.
